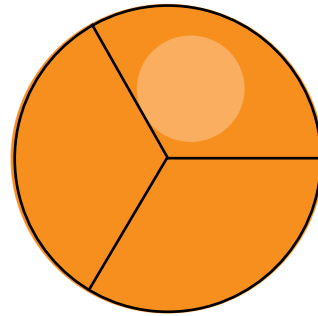




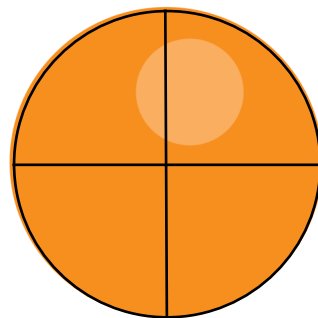
The ball is whole and not divided.









The ball is divided into two equal pieces.



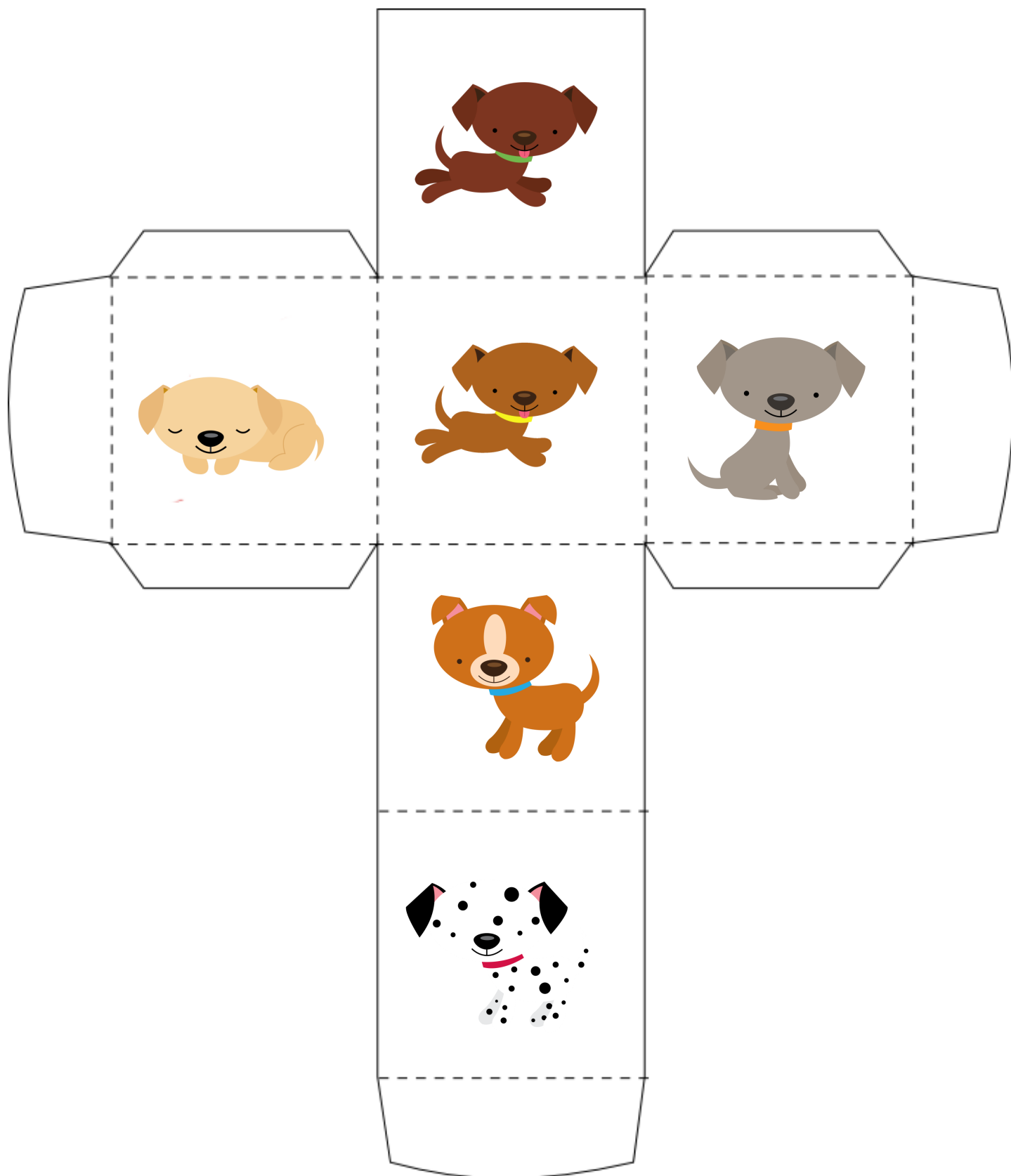
