I would highly recommend printing the activities from this set onto cardstock so that they are sturdier for younger hands.























The pirate found **one** bag of gold


















The pirate found **two** bags of gold.








Cut out the pages and count the bags of gold on each page of the booklet. Staple the book together and add to your lapbook.






The pirate's parrot is red.





Parrot

The pirate's parrot is orange.




Cut out the pages and color the parrots on each page of the booklet.

This is a fun and simple game to play with your preschooler! All you need is a game board {two pieces}, game piece markers {like small bingo chips}, and a die.

Directions:

Take turns rolling the die. If you land on one of the dark blue or brown dots, stop and read to see what you need to do. Sometimes you can move ahead, you might have to drop anchor and stay for a bit, or go back a few spaces. The first one to reach the 'x' marks the spot ~ wins!
