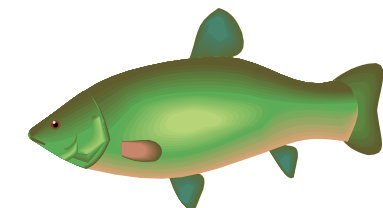
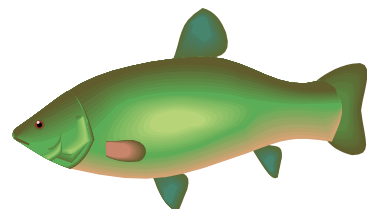
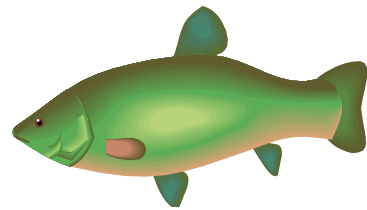
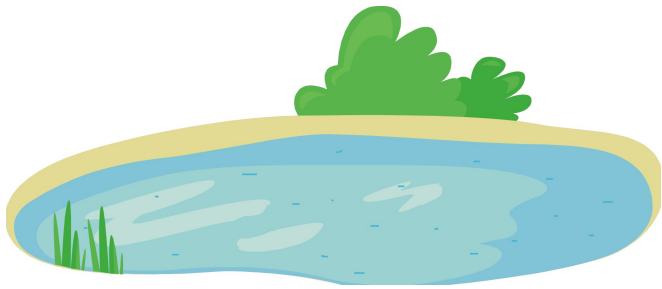
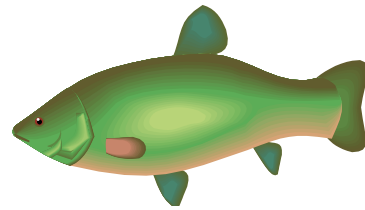
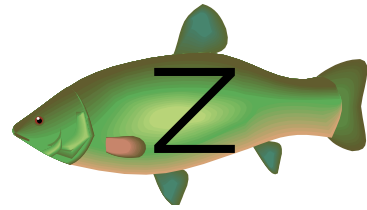








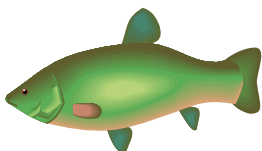
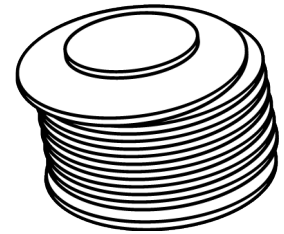
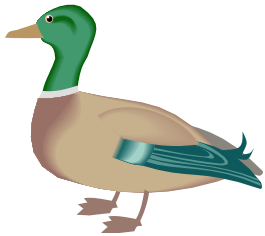
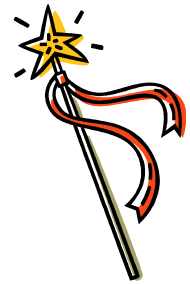
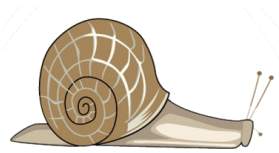




# Rhyming Word Match

Slide into a sheet protector and use a dry erase marker if you would like to re-use it.














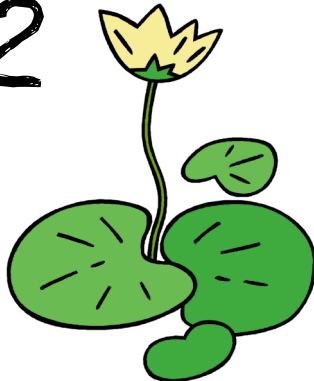
# Where's the Frog?

Cut out the lily pad numbers and the frog. Place the lily pads {you can put all 20 or fewer} on the table and hide the frog under one of the numbers. Have your child guess which lily pad the frog is underneath. This is a great activity for helping your child identify numbers up to 20. If your child correctly guesses where the number is hidden, have fun counting together up to that number. You can also have your child put the numbers in order independently.

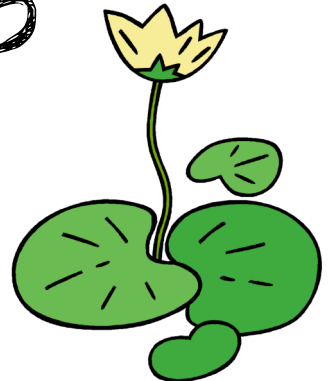
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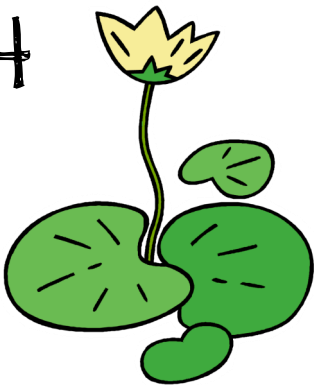
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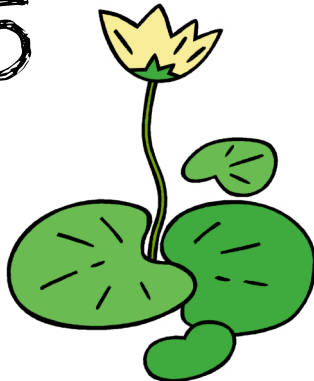
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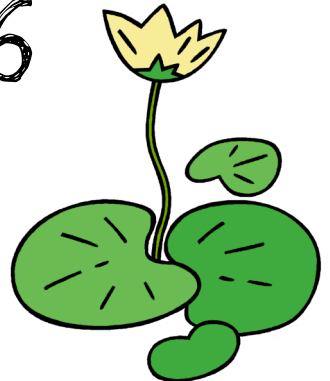
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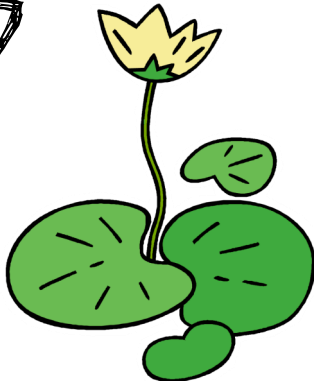
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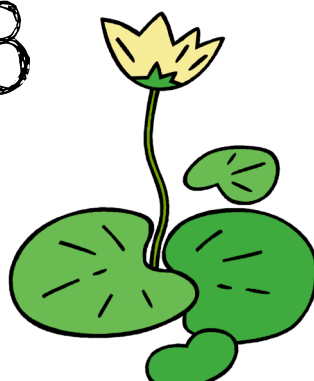
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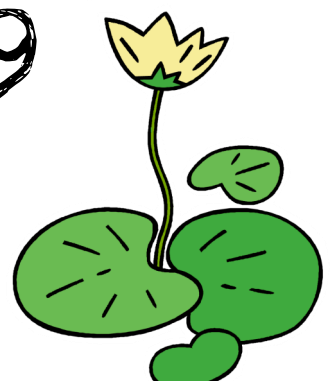
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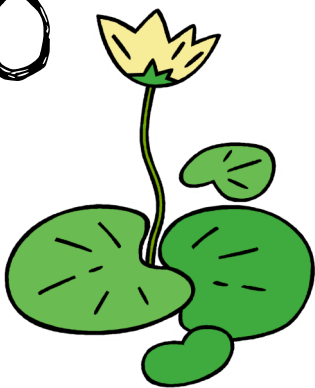
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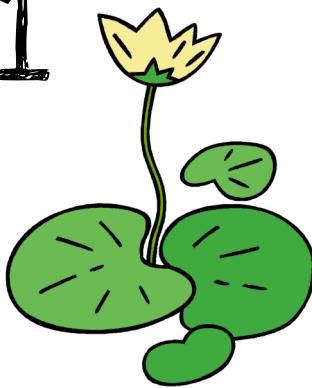
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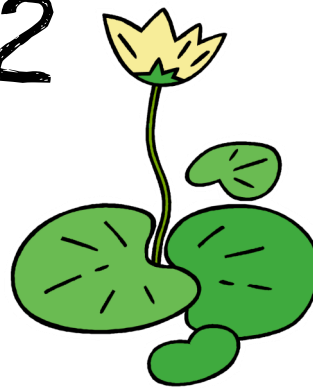
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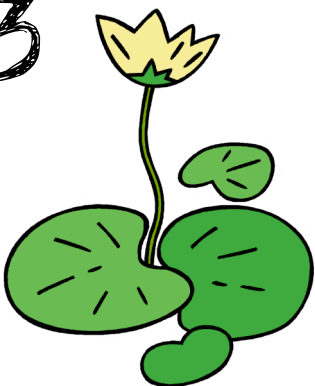
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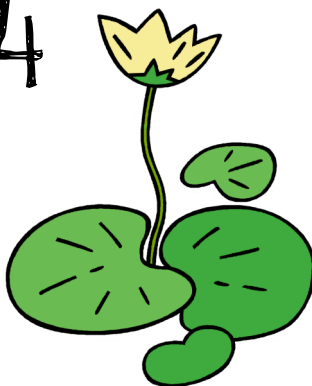
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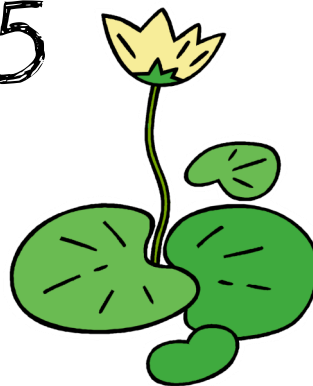
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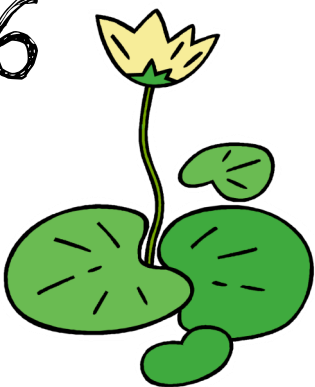
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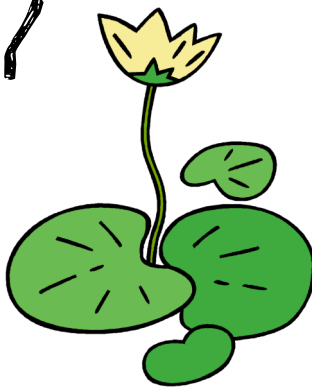
